

AVERAGE COST OF STUDYING AT FORT HARE - 2019

1. Introduction

In order to enable current and prospective students wishing to study at the University of Fort Hare in 2019, the following details are provided as a guide to determine the cost of study. *Please note that fees go up every year and this should be understood as a guide based on the current fee structure.

2. Fees

2.1 Non Refundable Application Fee – Tuition

Before the 31st September 2018.....	R 120
Online application.....	R80

2.2 Non Refundable Application Fee – Residence

Before the 31st September 2018.....	R 120
After 1st October 2018.....	R 300

2.3 Acceptance of accommodation payable

Before 31st December 2018.....	R1 000

2.4 Minimum Initial Payment (MIP)

Before any student is permitted to register at the University, the University requires such a student to make a Minimum Initial Payment (MIP) towards:

Tuition	R3500
Foreign Levy: Non SADC.....	R3000
Foreign Levy: SADC.....	R1500

2.5 Settlement of outstanding accounts

The balance owing after the payment of the minimal initial payment (MIP) must be settled as follows:

i. By the end of the first quarter (lectures end)	30%
ii. By the end of the second quarter (lectures end)	60%
iii. By the end of the third quarter (lectures end)	100%

2.6 Average Postgraduate fees for all campuses

NB. Meals are provided by a private company on cash basis. Students should provide about R6 000 for books.

3.3 Returning undergraduates

4. Methods of Payment

i. Direct deposits/internet payments

Direct deposits/internet payments can be made into the University's bank account at Standard Bank, Alice or East London, Branch Code 050119, Account Number: 282101357 or at First National Bank, Oxford Street East London, Branch Code 210121; Account Number.62150992016. The student number must be used as the reference when using this method of payment.

ii. Debit and credit card payments

Debit and credit card payments for student fees are accepted and payments can be made via the Cashiers office by the card holder.

iii. Debit Orders

Debit order payments are no longer accepted by the University. Students/Parents may, however, implement a Stop Order with their respective banks and submit a copy of the stop order to the Student Account's office on or before the 15th of January. This, however, will not exempt the student from paying the Minimum Initial Payment for registration. The last payment on your stop order should be set for the 31st October.

iv. Fundi (Previously known as Edu-Loan)
